Last Saturday, 8th August, we celebrated the Feast Day of St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's first saint. Mary Helen MacKillop was born on 15 August 1842 in Melbourne. In 1866 in Penola, South Australia, Mary MacKillop, with the support and encouragement of Fr Julian Tenison Woods, opened the first St. Joseph's School. Other young

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women followed Mary's example and joined her and so the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph began. Today, the Sisters of St. Joseph continue Mary's work by helping the poor and needy throughout the world. Mary was canonized in October 2010 by Pope Benedict XVI as Saint Mary MacKillop. St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop offers us a fine example of what we can achieve for the good of others with a strong faith, courage, trust and humility.

Saturday, 15th August, is the Feast of the Assumption when we celebrate Mary rising to Heaven body and soul. It is also a time for us to reflect on the kind of life and person that Mary was and learn from her example.



In the Gospel of Luke we see Mary say yes to the angel Gabriel who asked her to bear the Son of God. She was chosen by God to take on the responsibility of being the mother of our Saviour. This took Mary by surprise but she responded by saying yes, "be it done unto to me according to your word." Mary did not have an easy life. She watched her son strive to teach the Jewish people the message of God against powerful critics who opposed him. She witnessed his pain as Jesus, her only son, was accused of crimes he did not commit and was tortured and crucified but throughout these difficult times, Mary stayed faithful and found strength in God.

What can we learn from Mary?

We can learn to be faithful followers like Mary and "walk with God always, even in moments of weakness" and always remember, "God is our Strength."

Tomato and Cheese Damper

(0.1 serve of vegetables per damper) - Nut free/vegetarian

Ingredients

2 cups wholemeal flour 1 cup plain flour 1 tsp baking powder 1 pinch salt 5 tbsp olive oil ⅓ cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated 1 tbs rosemary, finely chopped 8 cherry tomatoes ½ cup reduced-fat milk ½ cup water

Method

Preheat the oven to 220°C. Line a baking tray with baking paper. Sift the flours, baking powder and salt into a bowl. Add the olive oil and combine with a wooden spoon until it resembles bread crumbs. Add the cheese and rosemary and mix through.

Make a well in the centre and add the milk and water. Use a knife and work the dough until it leaves the sides of the bowl. Gently knead the dough on a lightly floured board and split into 8 even pieces. Shape pieces into balls and arrange close together on the tray. Sprinkle with a little extra cheese, press a cherry tomato into the centre of each roll and sprinkle with more rosemary.

Bake for 25-30 minutes until golden and the bases sound hollow when tapped.
