Dear Parents and Children

The end of Term 2 is always a particularly busy time of year in the life of a school with teachers completing assessments, writing reports 5. and conducting parent/teacher conferences. Thank you to the parents who followed up their child's report with a parent/teacher conference. If you are yet to make an appointment with your child's teacher I encourage you to do so.

At Sacred Heart Primary School we have developed high expectations for our students' learning. When you read your child's report, re- 10. Provide a balanced life member to refer to the explanation of student achievement levels that describe your child's Living Life to the Full: our Draft New Curriculevel of success in each Key Learning Area. Also remember to pay attention to your child's effort and learning behaviours. You might like to refer to the following four tips:

- 1. Look for strengths first. Focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- 2. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then they have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.
- 3. Broaden your focus to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence their happiness and well- being, as well as give Notice to Parents: an indicator to his/her future.
- Discuss the report with your son or 4 daughter talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.

Here are some very good tips for parents as we prepare for the second half of the year. I will expand on these points in the first Newsletter for Term 3.

- 2. Have high, but realistic, expectations

lum for Religious Education

For several years now, our Catholic community has been working together to update the way we share our faith with children and young people. This draft new curriculum for Religious Education will be known as Living Life to the Full and is now available on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website together with a guide to help community members learn more.

Faithful to Sacred Scripture and Tradition, Catholic Teaching and Values, Living Life to the Full is designed to be age-appropriate for children and young people. When it is launched in late 2021 the Draft New Curriculum will replace 'Sharing Our Story', the current curriculum that has been in place for more than 20 vears.

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) collects data from schools to determine the Index of Community Socio-educational Advantage (ICSEA). CEDP is currently working to provide relevant details to the Catholic Education Commission of NSW. Data collected is de-identified of personal information.

Parents and caregivers must advise their school if they don't want their child's data included in this report by Wednesday 14 July 2021.
